THOUGHTS FROM Ben...



Hard to believe that midwinter break is almost here. That means it's time for the annual Valentines Day Skate on February 12. On Thursday, February 11 from 7:00-8:30 pm you can warm up for the skate with a general PTSA meeting tackling advocacy for alternative education.

Take a deep breath during the week away. When you return it will be time for the spring budget/staffing rush. Mark March 3 and 11 on your calendar for General PTSA meetings to discuss Orca's 2010-2011 budget.

Orca students also just completed the Measure of Academic Progress (MAP). MAP is an assessment taken by students K-8 on the computer. It is adaptive, meaning that the questions students receive change depending upon whether or not their answers are correct.

MAP assessments in reading and math are conducted three times during the year - early fall, in January and in April/May. Teachers use a variety of tools to monitor growth, including daily assignments, grades, observations, and tests. No single test can provide a complete picture of a student's knowledge and skills. A collection of different information helps provide the clearest picture of student performance.

If you are interested in learning more about your student's performance on MAP, please contact your child's teacher. They will be able to provide you with your student's MAP results and speak to how your student performed in specific skills areas. For more information about MAP, including resources

for parents and guardians, you may visit nwea.org or consult the Parent Guide to MAP which is available at your school. Please also feel free to ask me, or your child's teacher, about MAP.
